In the Philippines, people like to celebrate Christmas for a long time. September is when they start playing Christmas music and celebrate by going to parades, concerts, plays, and other events. Decorations can be seen everywhere, and every house has a nativity scene. Christmas lights are everywhere.

On December 16th, people attend up to nine different masses called 'Misa de Gallo' or 'Simbang Gabi'. The last mass is held on Christmas Eve. Then, Christmas celebrations begin and continue on to the First Sunday in January with the Feast of the Three Kings. The Wise Men are important as they are celebrated in a tradition called 'Parol'. Parol is a bamboo pole or frame with a lighted star lantern that represents the star that guided the Wise Men. They eat their favorite Bibingka and Puto Bumbongspecially seasoned rice dishes.

Santa R-Kayme Klaws, in his 70s, dresses up as Santa Claus for poor Filipino children. Children love receiving

presents, but they like receiving little red envelopes with money inside even more.



HOLIDAT/D AND TRADITIONS AROUND THE WORLD

In Romania, Christmas and Mid-Winter celebrations last from December 20th to January 7th. The 20th of December is called 'Ziua de Ignat' or 'Ignat Day'. It is a tradition that if the family keeps pigs, one of them is killed on that day by the head of the household. Shortly after the pig is killed, the family members share a dish called 'Pomana Porcului' or 'Pork's Charity'. It is traditionally cooked in a cauldron and consists of a variety of pork meat, such as pork belly, shoulder, liver, kidneys, etc. in a garlic sauce and served with polenta. The meat from the Pig is also used in the Christmas meals that they have. Romanians dress up in costumes including as bears and goats that dance and sing in the streets and at Christmas events.

## KAWNZAA

Kwanzaa is an African American holiday celebrated in the United and other countries. Created in 1966, the 7-day period is aimed at teaching and



recommitting to 7 principles of Kwanza: Unity, Self-Determination, Collective Work and Responsibility, Cooperative Economics, and Purpose, as well as Creativity and Faith. Celebrations can include feasts, music, dancing, and speeches. At the end, people are supposed to reflect on the 7 principles in their lives.

People also recommit themselves to these 7 principles and other cultural values.

## WINTER SOLSTICE-2020 By Grace Poulava

Later this month on the night of the Winter Solstice, you will see a very large "star" in the sky. This year in the northern hemisphere, Winter Solstice is on Dec.21 which is the shortest period of daylight and longest night of the year.

"You can witness a rare event in the night sky that has *not* been seen in almost eight centuries. The two largest planets in our solar system, Jupiter and Saturn, will align on Dec. 21 to create what's sometimes referred to as the "Christmas Star" or the "Star of Bethlehem," pointed out CBS News in "Rare 'Christmas Star' to Appear Dec. 21..."

The reason for the solstice and the season is that earth is tilted with respect to the sun at 235 degrees on average. The winter solstice celebrates the longest hours of darkness of the rebirth of the sun and is believed to hold a powerful energy for regeneration. The first winter celebration was in Ancient Rome. It began on December 17 and lasted for 7 days. Saturnalia banquets were held from as far back as around 217 BCE.

Later, Christians said that the "Bethlehem Star" appeared at this time of year. This year's Winter Solstice will be especially bright and beautiful due to the crossing of Jupiter and Saturn, creating an especially bright "star." Be sure to check out the night sky and enjoy what you see.





## HANUKKAH By Samantha Jaimes

Hanukkah is one of the more well known December holidays, taking place December 10th-18th in 2020. This celebration lasts a total of eight days. The most well known and important tradition of this Jewish holiday is the lighting of the eight candles on the 9 armed candelabra known as the Menorah. The 9th candle, the shamash, is used to light the other eight candles and can be found in the middle of the Menorah. A new candle is lit every day throughout the eight days. Hanukkah is also celebrated by giving gifts each day.

In 171 BC Israel had a new king, Antiochus IV. Antiochus did not allow people to follow their own religions and practices. Instead, he wanted them to follow the Greek religion and way of life. He terrorized the Jews burning down their houses and had tens of thousands put into slavery or killed. A rebellion was started by the Jewish Priest, Mattathias. Eventually, the Jews won against Antiochus and took back their Temple, which had been turned into a shrine for Zeus. It was rebuilt and was dedicated to God once again. Hanukkah is celebrated for eight days because of the oil lamp inside the temple that only had enough fuel for a day, but lasted for eight days. Hanukkah celebrates the Jew's victory and the taking back and rededication of the Jewish Temple.

Popular foods during Hanukkah include latkes (potato pancakes) and sufganiyot (jelly-filled doughnuts). You can also find gelt (chocolate coins) which are used for the dreidel game. Gelts are used as money in the game. The dreidel game is played using a dreidel which is a spinning four-sided top. On each side, there is a Hebrew letter representing a word. The letter name Nun means to take nothing out of the pot. Gimmel means to get all, Hey is take half and Shin

translates to share which means you add a gelt to the pot.

This game was created as a way for Jews to learn the Torah (Hebrew Bible). When Greek soldiers were nearby Jews would hide the Torah and would act as though they were playing a game with dreidels. Once again, the Jews found a way to persevere and continue to do what they believed in, even with all the hardships Antiochus gave them.



#### LOS POSADAS By Ronaldo Ramirez



Las Posadas is a holiday celebrated in Latin America, Spain, Mexico, Cuba, Guatemala, and in the United States by Latinx people.

This holiday is celebrated from December 16th through Christmas Eve. Las Posadas is a celebration of Mary and Joseph traveling to Bethlehem.

People's houses are decorated with moss, paper lanterns, and evergreens. Children are given candles and clay figures of Mary and Joseph. Then everyone goes to neighborhood homes and sings a song about Mary and Joseph asking for a room in the house.

The final Posada has a manger and figures of shepherds put onto a board. Once the people have found the baby, it is put into the manger and they go to a church service.

When it gets darker they start the party with food, games, and fireworks. Posada Pinatas are made out of paper mache and stuffed inside with treats. The goal is to break the piñata to get the treats out.

Epiphany is a Christian feast day held on January 6, 2021.

This event celebrates the arrival of the Magi, they visit the baby to bring him gifts from far off lands.


Epiphany is celebrated in many countries and is also called The Feast of the Three Kings. Some countries call it The 12th Day of Christmas.

In some countries, a special cake is baked with a small

crown, baby figure, or bean baked into the cake for which the finder of the special object is recognized in different ways. Many of the Epiphany traditions include a feast and special pastries.



Children receive small gifts in their shoes in honor of the Magi's gifts to baby Jesus. Baptisms are common. In Eastern European tradition, houses may be blessed during Epiphany.



## Eid-Al-Fitr Muslim Celebration

While Muslims do not celebrate Christmas, they have a similar celebration that some American Muslims compare to the Christian Christmas. It is called Eid-Al-Fitr, and it is celebrated in the 9th month of the Hijri calendar (lunar calendar).

Eid-Al-Fitr is a three day celebration following Ramadan, a month of daytime fasting and praying.



First, Muslims are encouraged to dress in their finest clothes and go to prayer and services. Then they are expected to make their *Alms* payments, money that is put aside to be paid to the poor.

After services, children are given many gifts, and women receive gifts from family members. In addition, people are urged to settle feuds or arguments, especially with relatives.







Often, large celebrations are held in community centers and mosques. Sometimes, there are carnivals and rides. In the US, people take family outings to amusement parks, skating rinks, or other entertainment centers.

In Russia, Christmas wasn't always easy to celebrate due to it being forbidden under communism-their old form of government.

But now, Christmas starts on December 31, and it ends January 10. Many people in Russia go to many church services during the Christmas holidays and fast (not eating) up to Christmas. Then they have dinners with 12 dishes to represent Christ's apostles.


