# **Access and Admission Policy**

#### **Statement:**

Arroyo School values the International Baccalaureate and its engaging and challenging curriculum, which encourages critical thinking, intercultural understanding, and respect. We welcome enrollment from any TK-8 student in schools within and outside of Ontario-Montclair School District (OMSD). We firmly believe in providing access to the IB philosophy for all.

### **Admission Requirements:**

Admission to Arroyo School is based on living in the boundaries of the Ontario Montclair School District or being able to provide transportation if you live outside of those boundaries. Students within those boundaries are automatically granted admission.

Students living outside the school boundaries will be granted admission while seats are available. If there should be more out of district applicants than available seats, a lottery will be held to determine admission. Students will be required to submit their transfer information and other supportinging documents required by Ontario-Montclair School District (such as proof of address, student physical/immunization records) at the time of admission. Students attending Ontario-Montclair School District IB schools will pay no tuition. Additionally, students will not be required to take placement tests for admission.
