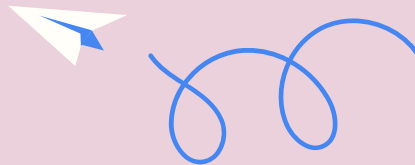
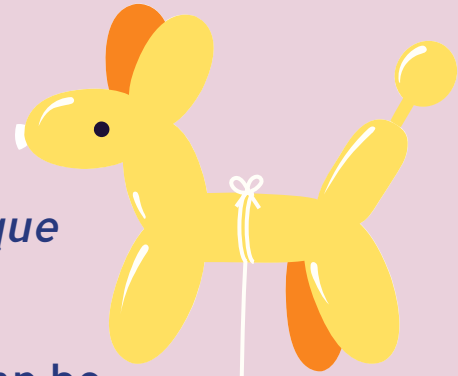

- Validating Emotions



# How can I help my child build Self-Awareness?

- Encourage your child to identify and express their emotions.
- Discuss different emotions and their causes.
- Validate their feelings and show empathy.
- Help your child reflect on their own behavior and emotions.
- Discuss situations where they handled emotions well or could improve.
- Use storytelling or role-playing to explore emotions.
- Foster a growth mindset, emphasizing the ability to learn and grow.

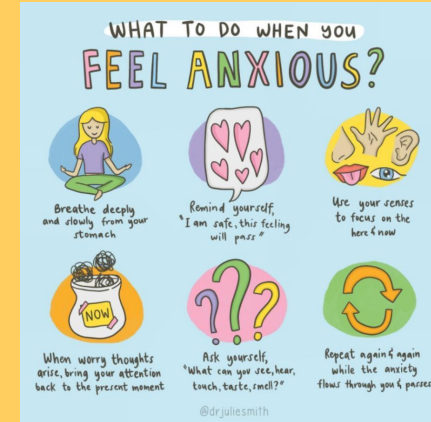

# How can I help my child build Self-Regulation?

- Help your child develop healthy coping mechanisms.
- Discuss ways to manage stress or disappointment positively.
- Encourage the use of hobbies or activities as outlets for emotions.
- Introduce mindfulness techniques for self-regulation.
- Practice deep breathing or meditation together.
- Teach them to recognize stressors and manage stress effectively.



# How can I help my child build Empathy and Social Skills?

- Teach the importance of active listening and model good listening yourself.
- Discuss perspectives and feelings of others.
- Volunteer or engage in activities that promote empathy.
- Encourage acts of kindness and consideration.
- Encourage cooperation and teamwork in group activities.
- Guide your child in solving problems on their own.
- Encourage them to think critically about solutions.
- Discuss potential consequences of different actions.
- Be a positive role model for the behavior you want to encourage.

# Emotional Intelligence and the Importance of Listening

- **Context: “Everyday life”- within reason/not during discipline**
- **Active listening (not distracted, eye contact, at their level, responding)**
- **Enter into their world (notice and wonder). Their world is important.**
- **Bids for attention**
- **Empathy (“That must have hurt/made you excited...”)**
- **Listen with an “inner ear”. Sometimes the “thing” is not the “thing”.**
- **Find their best time /mode of communication (on walks, shoulder to shoulder, during meals, while snuggling, before bedtime, etc.)**
- **Enjoy them! See them! Giggle, laugh, dance!**

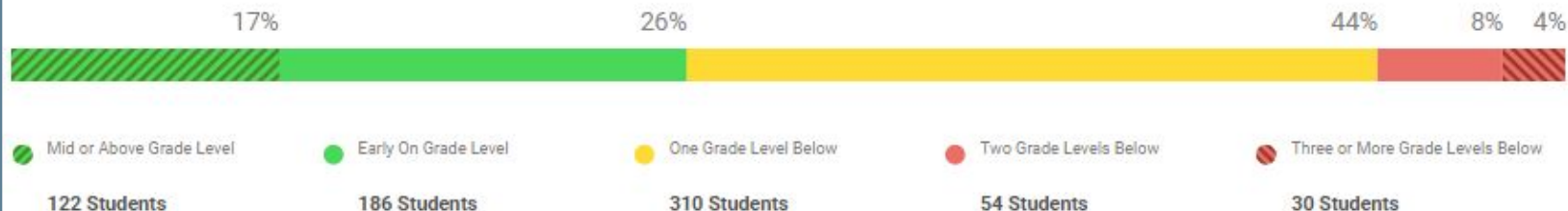
