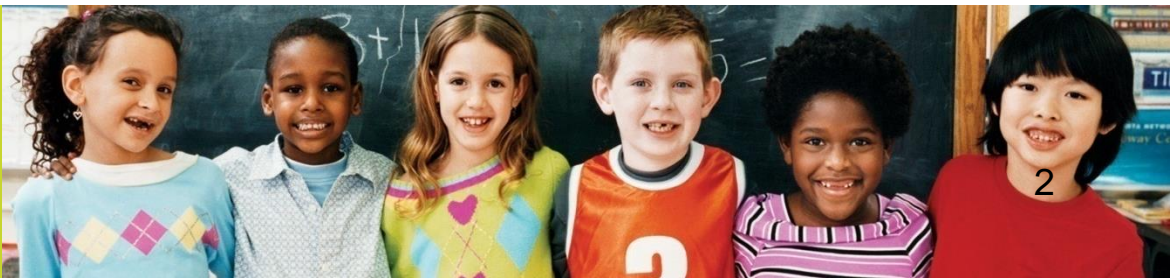

Small universal scholarship

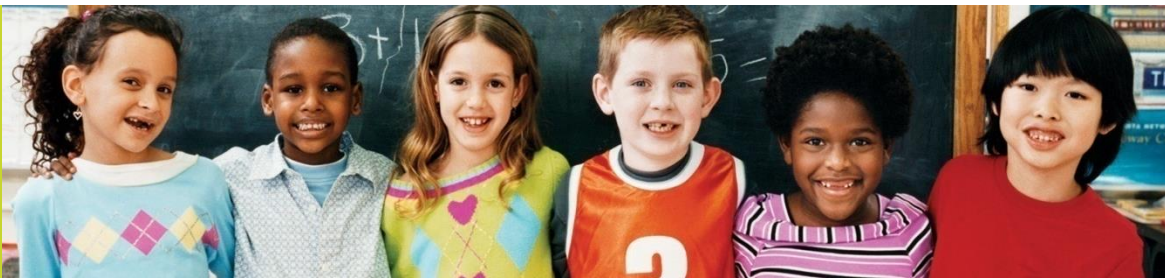
- Attended OMSD in 8th grade and then a CJUHSD high school

- Complete FASFA

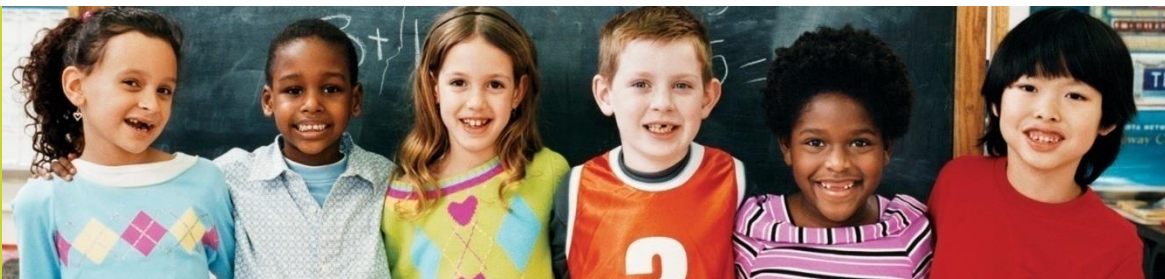


Montclair Chaffey College Scholarship

= **2 years College Tuition at Chaffey College and Text books**

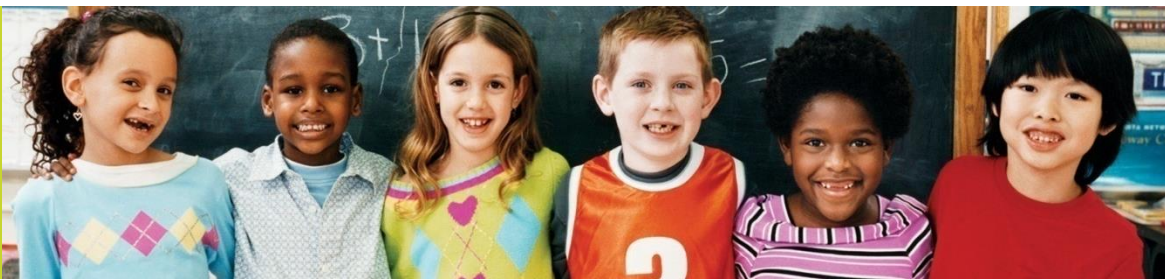

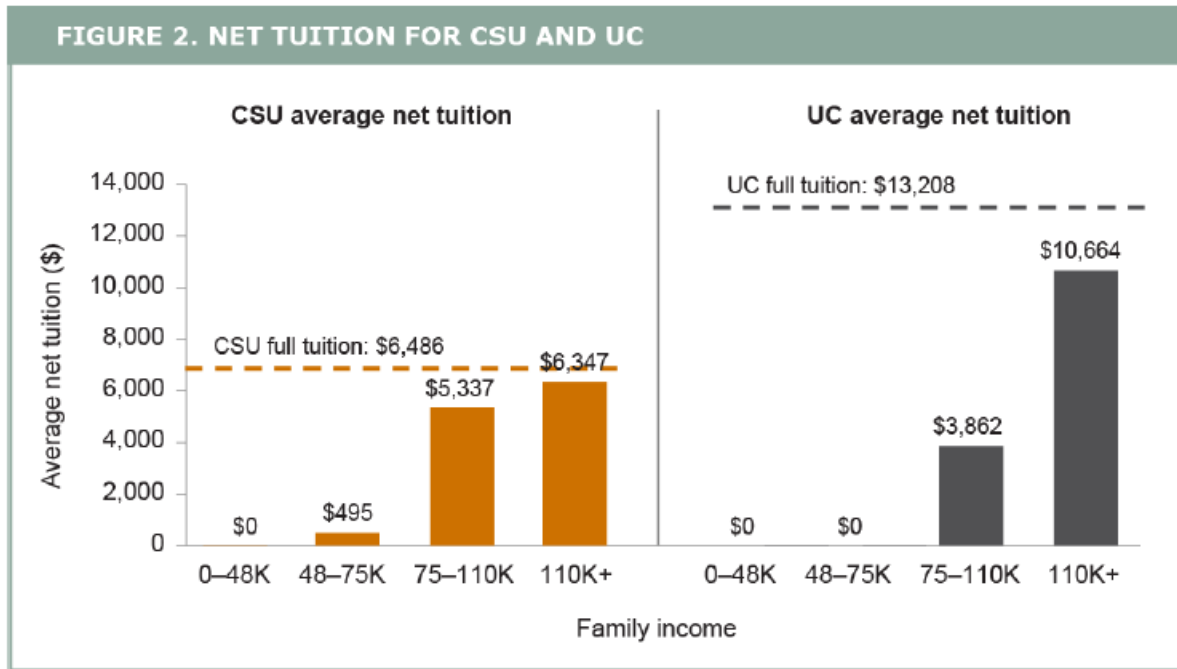


Ontario Community College Promise

- A scholarship program for high school graduates which will provide **free tuition for up to two consecutive years** at a public California community college of the student's choice.
- Must have lived in the City of Ontario for the 2-year period prior to high school graduation.
- Must complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and DREAM Act application by the deadline applicable for their high school senior year.

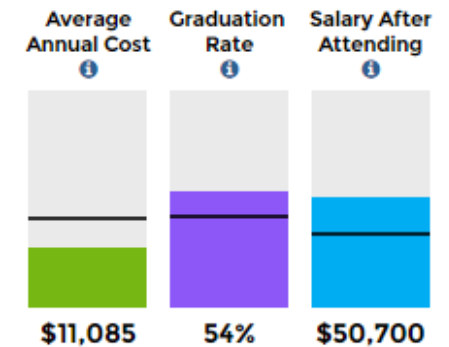

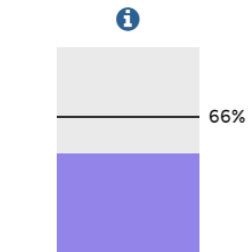
