CalKIDS is a California state program that helps children save for college or career training after high school.

Children born in California starting on July 1, 2022, and eligible low-income public-school students are awarded a CalKIDS college savings account with an initial deposit in it. Research shows that children with higher education savings accounts are more likely to go to college.

SEL

During the month of February, the SEL skill of focus will be "Relationship Skills." Students that are strong in this area typically show strengths in the following skills: Communication, social engagement, relationship building, teamwork, and leadership. The lessons this month are geared towards helping students learn how to strengthen relationships with their peers and communicate effectively. Some ways that you can reinforce this behavior at home are....

- <u>Talk about your day:</u> There is something special about your child giving insight on how their day went. Take a few minutes to ask your child how their day was. Ask them what the high and low was of their day. If they had a rough day, ask them what they have the power to change to make it better. By having this conversation, it allows students to communicate what is going on, as well as share how they are feeling.
- <u>Teamwork:</u> If your family has a chore day, write on a board or a piece of paper which chores you'd like each family member to tackle. Set a time limit and work as a team to accomplish completing the chores. Have an incentive for everyone if they complete their chores in the set amount of time. The reward can be as simple as enjoying ice cream together.
