The average age of children adopted by Californians are newborns to 9 years old. For children 9 and older, the chances of getting adopted has dropped significantly because most people don't want to adopt a teenager. In 2012, 3,335 children in California aged out of foster care without a permanent family. The Adoption Assistance Program (AAP) is an entitlement program to provide financial and medical coverage to facilitate the adoption of children who otherwise would remain in long-term foster care.



What is the Great Shake Out?

The Great Shake Out is a state wide earthquake drill. People, especially students, use this opportunity to ensure that they have safe standards and procedures

in place in case there ever is a real earthquake or other disaster.

For an earthquake, you drop, cover your head, and hold onto something heavy. The reason we do the Great Shake Out is so we are prepared for earthquakes, whenever and wherever they might strike. In preparation of any earthquakes,

Here are some ways that you and your family can celebrate Native American Heritage Month! You can visit an






