"I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their

Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday, his life and role in the *Civil Rights Movement*. He is famous for peacefully protesting injustice against people of color in the United States from the mid-1950s until he was assassinated in 1968.



He never forgot the time when he was six years old and one of his white playmates announced that his parents would no longer allow him to play with King, Jr. because the children were attending segregated schools.

Martin Luther King, Jr. was born on January 15, 1968, in Atlanta, Georgia, and followed his minister father into the ministry. He learned in college about peaceful protests and how to stand up and protest against injustice.

When King, Jr. got older he started making speeches about segregation and how it was not right that people of color could not drink out of the same drinking fountain as white people.

He organized the Southern Christian Leadership Conference to coordinate activities and events to help win equal rights for all people. He also organized the Montgomery Bus Boycott where Black Americans would not ride the bus because people of color like Rosa Parks had to give up their seats on the bus to white people. One of his most famous speeches, I Have A Dream, was given at the 1963 March On Washington.



Valentine's Day happens every year on February 14, across the states and all around the world. Gifts such as candy, flowers, and stuffed animals are exchanged between friends and significant others. School children often exchange Valentine's Cards that may contain candy. Decorations typically feature Cupid and his arrows, doves, and hearts.

This holiday is celebrated as a Christian and Roman tradition, as this event is associated with St.Valentine, a patron Saint. There are many stories about how St. Valentine came to be chosen. Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men were better soldiers than those who have wives and families, he disallowed marriage for young men.

Valentine, noticing the injustice of the matter, didn't listen to Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death.

Still, many insist that it was Saint Valentine of Terni, a bishop, who was the true inspiration for the holiday. He was also beheaded by Claudius II outside Rome.

Today, we celebrate this holiday as a way to remember those we love. So, Happy Valentine's!

SEAL OF BILITERACY By Brianna Valles (Republished)






