Our History

The Ontario-Montclair School District, founded in 1884, serves a 26 square mile area which covers most of the city of Ontario, Montclair, portions of Upland, and unincorporated areas of San Bernardino County. The District is the third largest elementary district in the State.

More than 19,000 PreK-8 students attend 26 elementary schools, 6 middle schools, and 2 alternative programs. Included in the 34 schools are magnet and academy programs, each of which is uniquely designed to provide an option for students to become fully immersed in an enhanced specially designed course of study, and two alternative programs.

OMSD boasts two California Distinguished Schools, eleven Gold Ribbon Schools, International Baccalaureate Schools, a GATE Magnet, a STEM Magnet, Dual Language Academies, and Arts-integrated Magnet, and many AVID Schools, as well as many other State and Nationally recognized programs.

Spelling Bee

Poetry Day

OMSD sponsors an annual Poetry Day during the month of April to allow TK-8th grade students to enjoy, discover and share poetry. Poet led workshops are offered to school sites to inspire students to create original poetry submissions. Student-created poems are submitted to the District and judged using the following criteria: Originality, Following Poetry Genre, Creativity, Presentation Quality, and Conventions. All student poets and their families are invited to attend Poetry Day. Winning submissions are spotlighted during the Poetry Day event, with opportunities to read their poetry aloud.



Robot Rally

The annual OMSD Robot Rally features over 300 students as they team up to battle with their robots in three competitive events: Follow the Line, Obstacle Course and Sumo. Teams collaborate as they observe, collect data, and apply revisions to their computer coding and robot designs. Many of these same OMSD students take their coding, engineering and robotics skills to the Cal Poly Pomona Robot Rally where they compete with teams from all over the Inland Empire. Parents, teachers and siblings also participate in the showcase rooms where they experiment with engineering projects, entry-level robotics and computer coding.



Coding

Each OMSD school offers an after school coding club allowing OMSD students the opportunity to use code.org, Google's Computer Science First program and MIT's Scratch coding to create stories and solve problems. The activities embedded in these coding clubs require perseverance, problem solving, and attending to precision which are skills that naturally transfer to subjects like reading and math. For students interested in getting to the next level of computer science, OMSD also offers Codesters which teaches Python, a widely used, high-level, general-purpose programming language. Thousands of students have decided to climb aboard the computer science rocket that is currently taking off from the classrooms and hallways of OMSD.

STEM

In the spirit of STEM Learning, for students in grades 4-8, the OMSD STEM Symposium combines:

- **Math Pentathlon** - Students compete in 5 challenging Math activities.
- **Science Fair** - This event highlights students learning in science through the judging and display of science fair boards.
- **Crazy Contraption Contest** - Students are challenged to design a solution to an engineering problem to "Build a Better Mousetrap."
- **Citizen Science Exhibit** - Families have a chance to experience learning science as they wander through the Citizen Science Exhibits.

STEM / AVID

AVID is an elective class that meets 5 days a week at each middle school. The **AVID** tutorial provides OMSD students support across content areas, twice a week, with an **AVID** tutor and a maximum of seven students in each group. **AVID** tutors return each Friday to provide students feedback on Binders, Agendas, the Focus Note-Taking process, and Goal Setting to maintain success. **AVID** focuses on building relationships through problem-solving, innovation, and collaboration. Students learn presentation skills as they participate in tutorials, collaborative study groups, Socratic Seminars, and Philosophical Chairs. **AVID** students are visited by guest speakers who share their educational and professional experience. All **AVID** students visit a variety of colleges and universities annually to better plan and achieve their goals of college and career readiness. For **AVID** recruitment, each middle school hosts a parent event and two additional meetings are hosted at the district office. The district provides over 30 sections of **AVID** annually. OMSD provides every opportunity for students to join the **AVID** program and matriculate to **AVID** in high school.

TRAVEL SPORTS TEAMS

Students who participate on their school teams will have an opportunity to tryout to play on the OMSD All Star Travel Team at the end of the OMSD Basketball, Soccer and Volleyball seasons. All tournament fees and uniform cost will be paid by OMSD.

Basketball - Players in grades 5, 6, 7, and 8 will enter local tournaments and compete against some of the best local basketball programs. Teams will be coached by OMSD staff.

Soccer - OMSD has partnered with the Celtic Soccer Club. Our teams will enter the Celtic Soccer League and compete against some of the best soccer clubs in our area. Teams will also play in several Celtic Club tournaments. Students in grades 5, 6, 7 and 8 can compete.

Volleyball - OMSD has partnered with FORZA Volleyball. Our teams will enter the FORZA League and compete against some of the best volleyball teams in the area. They will also be entered in several FORZA volleyball tournaments. FORZA will provide clinics for our players and our coaches. Students in grades 6, 7, and 8 can compete. Teams will compete at the wonderful FORZA facility.

All 5th graders visit a community college to start to envision themselves in college. The tour of the campus includes career technical training programs as well as associates (AA) and bachelors (BA) degree pathways. Students develop awareness of college and training options after high school. This activity helps develop “academic mindsets” of sense of belonging to an academic community, academic motivation, and self-efficacy. Students report increases in goal-setting, seeing themselves as college students, and general college knowledge.

UNIVERSITY VISITS

PROMISE SCHOLARS UNIVERSITY VISITS

All 8th graders visit a regional university to interact with campus academic and student support services and meet first generation college students. 8th graders learn about financial aid and planning for their high school course requirements. This activity helps develop “academic mindsets” of college-going identity (seeing students like himself in the setting) and self-efficacy. Students report understanding college enrollment requirements and college knowledge and planning.

Elementary Music Program (grades 3-6)

All 3rd grade students participate in weekly choral and percussion classes. All 4th grade classes learn to play the song flute. Instrumental music lessons are available for 5th-6th graders who select to participate in strings or band. An Honor Band and Orchestra are offered to represent selected elementary and middle school musicians. These groups practice weekly and perform in a showcase in May.

Middle School Music Program

Middle school students have various music electives at their school from which they may choose. Selected middle school students are invited to participate in OMSD's Honor Band, Honor Orchestra or Honor Choir. Groups practice weekly with an end of year showcase held in May. Food Festival






SCHOOL BOUNDARIES
