Ontario-Montclair School District's Corona Elementary School to receive a campus 'makeover' from the Inland Empire United Way

Inland Empire United Way (IEUW) is celebrating National Volunteer Week with a school makeover at Corona Elementary School. Corona Elementary School is located at 1140 N. Corona Avenue in Ontario and is a Preschool through 5th grade campus in the Ontario-Montclair School District.
