

CALIFORNIA MANDATORY COMMERCIAL RECYCLING LAWS



RECYCLING

The commercial sector generates nearly 3/4 of the solid waste in California. Much of the commercial sector waste disposed in landfills is readily recyclable.

Assembly Bill 341 requires all businesses and multi-family units that generate 4 cubic yard or more of trash per week to arrange for recycling services.

Effective July 1, 2020, MCR- and MORE-covered businesses must provide organics and recycling containers at front-of-house to collect waste generated from products purchased and consumed on the premises. Full-service restaurants do not have to provide containers for patrons but must provide containers for employees to separate post-consumer recyclables and organics for customers.
