## Health Office News

### Students Presenting Symptoms at Home

In an effort to maintain a healthy school environment and to mitigate the spread of the COVID-19 virus, we ask that all parents screen their child for COVID-19 symptoms each morning before they send them to school, and keep them at home if they are sick. If anyone in the home has COVID please keep your child at home and call the office.

This shared responsibility is critical to our ability to keep everyone safe, healthy and attending in person each day.

Please report your child's illness with details of all symptoms to our health office at 909-986-1215 ext. 223. Our Health Office will follow up on all students that are at home with COVID-19 symptoms.



In the event that your child tests positive for COVID, please report it to the office immediately and do not send your child to school. We will provide work for them to complete at home.



The district has a CAT process. CAT is short for COVID Action Team. They will call families if they need to verify COVID results and if we determine

your child was in close contact. Please don't worry, this team is responsible for communicating with families. We will be with you every step of the way and you can call us
