Parent Involvement at Home!

Did you know that supporting your child's education begins at home? Consider these everyday ways to talk about school, deepen their learning, and keep track of school news.

Foster a positive attitude—If you're enthusiastic about school, your child is likely to be as well. Ask them about projects they are working on or topics they are studying. Be sure to listen closely, and follow up with questions or comments. Also, you can influence their attitude to-

wards school by being positive.

Tie learning to their world—Show your child how what they learn is useful outside of school. If their studying clouds, ask them to identify types you see in the sky and try to predict whether you'll need an umbrella.
