Being Responsible!

Megan keeps up with her homework and is always ready for soccer practice on time. The reason? She has learned about responsibility from a young age. Consider these hands-on ways to help your child be responsible, too.

Part of the Team—Show your child that everyone's responsibilities matter. Have them cut bookmark-sized strips of paper and write a family activity on one (eating dinner). On the others, they should write jobs that make it happen (plan the meal, buy groceries, cook, set the tale).

Now let them link the strips to make a chain. They'll see that dinner relies on everyone doing their job!

Around the Clock—Help your child get in the habit of han-



dling their responsibilities on time. Let them draw a clock on paper or poster board and add sticky notes labeled with daily tasks. They might put "homework" at 4pm and "walk the dog" at 7pm. Have them post the clock in a visible spot as a reminder.

Caught in the Act— "Catch" your child being responsible, and tell them you noticed. ("That was responsible of you to throw away your trash.") You could even snap photos of their responsible behavior (say, making their bed) and hang them on the refrigerator. Seeing the photos will inspire them to continue to be responsible.

Review Report Cards!

When your child's next report card arrives (the week of March 16th) use it to encourage them to finish the school year strong. Try these strategies for discussing it:

Give your child, and their report card, your full attention. For example, find a quite spot to go over it.

Find reasons to high-five your child. Maybe they brought up their writing grade or the teacher commented on how well they get along with their classmates.

Talk about ways they can improve. If their math grade dropped, they might need to double cheek their work for careless errors. Or if they need to be more organized, share strategies you use.
